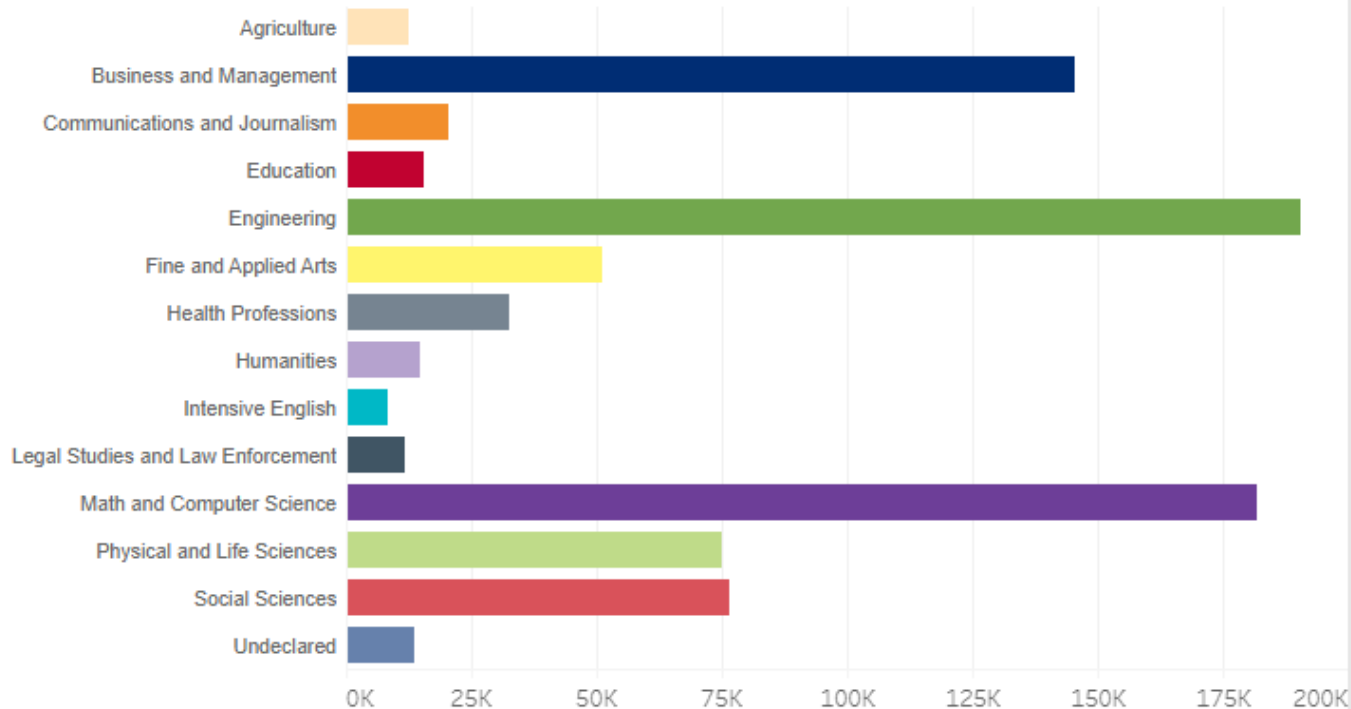

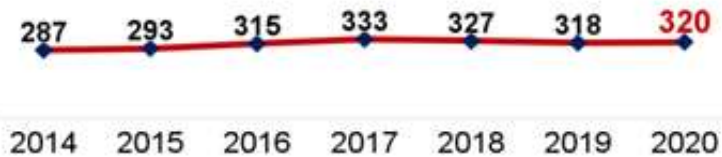

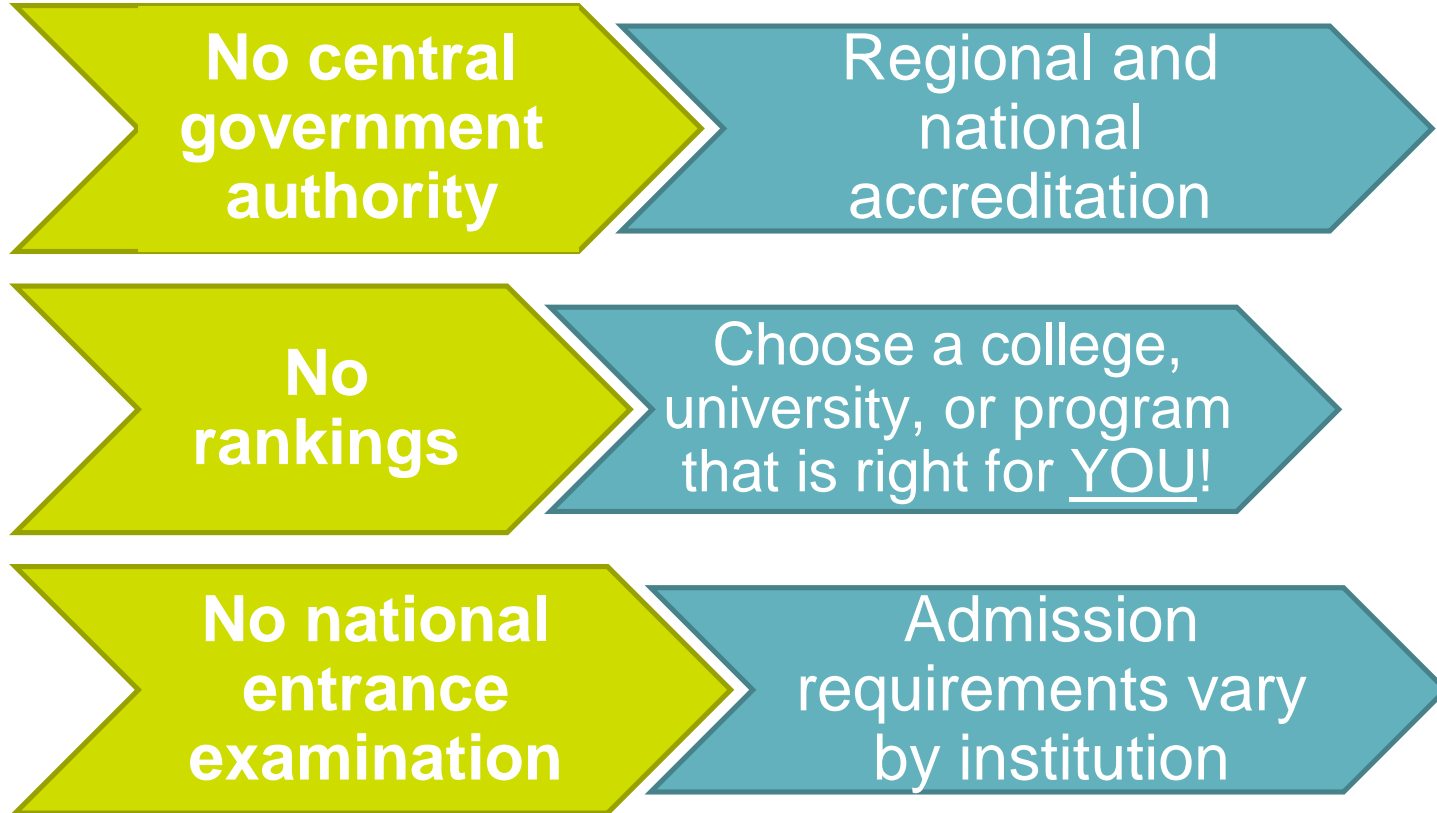

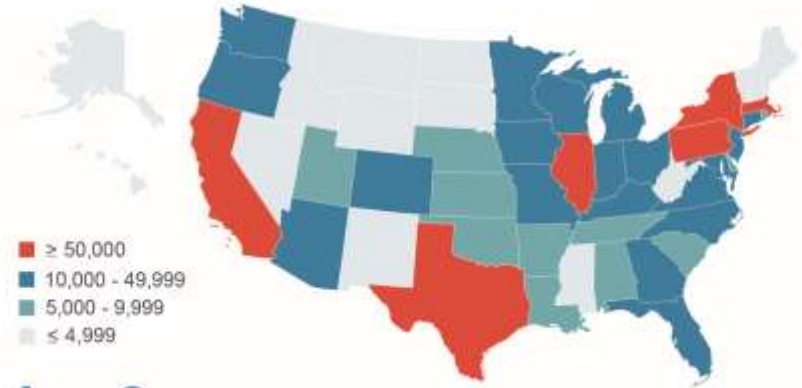

The term “Ivy League” was officially used in 1954 to describe an athletic conference involving the schools. The term “Ivy” was first used by a sportswriter in 1933. Ivy League schools are also called the “Ancient Eight” or just the “Ivies.”

Brown University, Columbia University, Cornell University, Dartmouth College, Harvard University, the University of Pennsylvania, Princeton University, and Yale University.

14 of the 25 largest sports stadiums in the world belong to American college football teams.

Harvard has the largest academic library in the world, with 15.8 million volumes.

In hard times, early colleges in the U.S. were forced to accept payments such as cotton, sheep, pewter (alavas), and food rather than hard currency.

Harvard receives the largest financial endowments of any institution in the world at \$26 billion.
